This year's show was juried by Kauanoe Chang who taught art at McKinley HS in Honolulu from 1970-1985. She has exhibited in many one-man shows and group shows on O'ahu and Hawai'i Island and is one of the founding members and first Director of HOEA (Hawaiian 'Ohana for Education in the Arts).

Most recently, she was named a MAMo (Maoli Arts Month) Awardee, which recognizes the contributions and accomplishments of Native Hawaiian visual artists and their influence and commitment in promotiing, perpetuating and celebrating Hawai'is culture and peoples through the visual arts. Along with other Native Hawaiian artists, her works will be featured in an invitational art exhibit at the Wailoa Art Gallery in Hilo from April 2023.
