From the Board...

Many of you know that I was a successful gallery owner, and I hope these tips might help the Firehouse Gallery docents/members when they are inhouse and meeting new potential customers. As an inveterate gallery goer I absolutely detest being followed about by gallery staff telling me all about anything I look at and as a result I developed these simple few lines for greeting customers:

- 1.) Stay in place at the desk but say "Welcome to the Firehouse Gallery" as soon as someone enters.
- 2.) Ask them to "Please sign our register letting us know where you learned of our gallery ."
- 3.) Then tell them that "our gallery is a non-profit volunteer run space and most of our docents display some of their work here."

That's enough to tell them. They might possibly then ask which is YOUR artwork. That's a good chance to show them your pieces and answer any ?'s they pose. Often potential buyers WANT to meet the artists and have an interaction with them. Keep this factor in mind when making yourself available for covering gallery days.

Try NOT to make remarks about any of the artwork they might be looking at. The exception might be when you are writing up a sales slip you might say "He/She is one of our most popular artists and sells guite well."

Of course if the customer asks a lot of questions, do your best to give them honest accurate replies. If you don't know, then say you will try to find out and send or call them with the answer. **CUSTOMER SERVICE** is what gallery sales are all about. It's not the amount of money being spent but how the customer feels when they've left the premises. Happy and satisfied is what you hope that they take out the door with them and tell their friends about.

If anyone thinks of something that works for them when greeting customers, please share it with me. I'm always eager to learn any new way to spur sales. But here I want to reiterate that being there in person and showing someone YOUR artwork is the best way to make sales - HANDS DOWN the very best way!!!!

The next reception is June 6 from 3 - 6 pm. Please plan to be there and spread the word. We are going to be having fewer receptions going forward, but will continue to hold them for the bigger event shows, and would like to see everyone come to show their support of the arts community at large.

Next board meeting will be on Sat., June 6 at 1:30 pm, followed by the reception for the current show at 3 pm. Any member of WAC is welcome to attend board meetings. If you have a subject you wish discussed, please contact Amaury.
