(Hwy. 19 and 190), across from the Waimea Chevron. Exhibits change monthly. The gallery is open Wed.-Fri. and Sun., 11 am to 3 pm, and Sat., 9 am to 3 pm. There is plenty of free parking behind the gallery.



pieces that symbolize Waimea, such as local landmarks, festivals, parades, ranching, Mauna Kea, Japanese culture, etc. Items must be available for sale. Paintings and photographs must be framed, wired, labeled and ready for hanging in the gallerye. No saw tooth hangers will be allowed. Maximum size 24" x 36", preferably smaller.

Member artists can also bring in cards and matted prints with a similar theme. The show will be on display from February 1 to February 25, 2017. Deadline for entries for the exhibit is January 28. Space will determine how many can be displayed.

Looking ahead - Cherry Blossom Festival

On the day of the festival, Feb. 4, there will be opportunities (weather permitting) for artists to paint on their easels either at Church Row Park, where our town's unique pink blossoming trees are planted, or artists can set up easels and paint on the lawn fronting the Waimea Arts Council buildings. There will be other activities in and around the Waimea Historic Corner.

We will need extra volunteer gallery docents on Feb. 4, from 8 am to 4 pm. We'll have two shifts (8 am -to 12 pm and 12 pm to 4 pm). This is one of the busier days of the year with lots of visitors and sales at the gallery. Contact Pat Dinsman or just sign up online or on the calendar in the gallery.

Here are a couple of thoughts:

- 1. Have your own website. Create it yourself or find someone to help you. WAC hopes to have more workshops on this subject in the future.
- 2. **Join the Gallery of Artists** at the Firehouse Gallery. To have a profile created for this display, go to waimeaartscouncil.org and click on "Membership" and then on "Member Links" from the drop down menu (or go to the bottom of the Membership page). Click on the link "Gallery of Artists Form" and you will find all the instructions and where to send the information. There is no charge for this profile to be created and displayed in the gallery. - 3. Get yourself listed on the WAC website. On the website, click on the "Artists" tab to see what this looks like. If you already have a website of your own, this would create a link to that site; however, having your own website is not a requirement. There is a mere one time \$25 charge for this service to set it up. Contact Julie McCue at jmccue@hawaii.rr.com and let her know that you want to proceed. She will let you know what she needs and will get the profile from Susan. Yyou must do a Gallery of Artists profile first.

Hint for docents - if you sign up online to docent.

I sometimes get the question, "When I look at the calendar on the website and roll the cursor over a date, why does it show a time?" This is showing the time the docent signed up. To eliminate this when you sign up, remember to erase the Time entry (below the End Date entry). This is not critical, but if you don't erase it, it will display the time you entered the information, which is a little confusing. I would suggest that you erase the date, and write "docent 11 - 3 (or whatever time you plan to be there)" in the Event Description box near the top so that whenever anyone puts their cursor on that date, it will show when you plan to be at the gallery. Things go awry as his props prove most unhelpful: his ladder disintegrates under foot! He wrangles an animated chair, tussles with a pesky hat, negotiates a precarious slack wire and juggles almost everything. Theatre goers even get involved in the endeavor by tossing lemons for Jamie to catch on a fork...held between his teeth!

An expert at comedy born of desperation, Jamie's performance is humble and unguarded. Adkins deftly escorts the audience along his poetic journey with sidesplitting wit. \$33 / \$28 / \$23 / \$18
