These two have spent countless hours in applying for grants - researching available ones, filling out all necessary forms, checking and rechecking them for accuracy typos, finding the information required. and meeting deadlines for turning them in.



They were successful this past year in acquiring a \$10,000 grant from The Laura Jane Musser Fund for for the second time. Some of these funds have helped us update our website, do needed repairs and maintenance on the buildings we occupy, and increase the number of workshops we have been able to offer.

The Firehouse Gallery is the most visible project of the Waimea Arts Council, an all-volunteer non-profit organization that sponsors programs, exhibits and education related to the arts.

It is strategically located in the heart of downtown Kamuela in South Kohala's historic old fire station, at the crossroads of Mamalahoa Highway and Lindsey Rd. (Hwy. 19 and 190), across from the Waimea Shell Station. Exhibits change monthly. The gallery is open Wed.-Fri. and Sun., 11 am to 3 pm, and Sat., 10 am to 3 pm. There is plenty of free parking behind the gallery.

11th Annual Paradise Studio Art Tour

The 11th Annual Paradise Studio Art Tour is being held on the first weekend in December, the 2nd and 3rd, 10 to 4 each day.

The public is invited to visit artists in their home studios in Hawaiian Paradise Park, Keaau. There is no charge. Seven studios with 25 local artists are featuring oil painting, watercolors, pastels, inks, acrylic, lava looking cement, jewelry making, pottery, silk painting, fashion art, mosiacs, photography and more. Each year the Artist Collective members donate 10% of their sales to Puna District public high schools for art supplies. Nearly \$14,000 has been donated to Pahoa and Keaau high schools and the Hawaii Academy for Arts & Sciences. This helps with the art department budget cuts of consumable resources, such as paper, drawing pencils, brushes, paint, and clay. The collective believes by presenting students with hands on materials and opportunities to view demonstrations of the creative processes during the tour, the tradition of passing down the model of a successful working artist continues.
